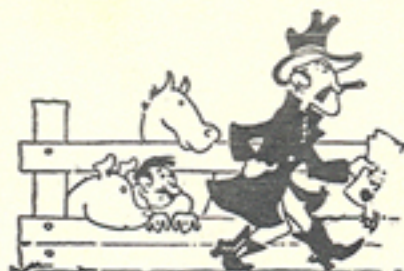

MARCH MEETING

Hon. Meade F. Griffin, recently appointed as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Texas, will address the regular monthly meeting of the Association.

The time is Monday, March 27th, at 12:15 Noon. The Place is the Plaza Hotel.

Justice Griffin will speak on a subject of his own choosing.

Mr. Henry Lee Taylor who was a classmate of Justice Griffin at the University of Texas and who served with him during the last war will introduce the speaker.

Meade F. Griffin has had a long and honorable career as a lawyer and public servant. He is a native Texan, born in Cottonwood, Texas. He was graduated from the University of Texas in 1917 with AB and LLB degrees. That same year he attended the first officer training camp at Leon Springs earning his commission as Captain.

After serving in World War I, Justice Griffin became mayor of Tulia. He moved to Plainview, Texas, in 1920, and that is now his home.

He has served two terms as County Judge of Hale County, seven years as District Attorney for the 64th Judicial District and since 1934

He was appointed Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, effective April 1, 1949.

As a colonel in World War II, he helped establish the trial section of the War Crimes Branch of the Army and served as Chief of Prosecution Subsection at Wiesbaden, Germany. He is now a reserve colonel in the Judge Advocate General Corps.

Justice Griffin has been a member of the State Bar for many years, and served as director from 1939 to 1942. He has been active on such committees as Prevention of Unauthorized Practice of Law, War Work and Veterans and State Courts Housing.
