The Aquifer Controversy

"The Practical Legal Implications of the Aquifer Controversy" will be the topic during the regular monthly luncheon of the San Antonio Bar Association, scheduled at 12 Noon Monday, January 29, in the Civic Center of Luby's Cafeteria, Main Plaza Building.

The featured speaker for this program will be Stanley D. Rosenberg of the law firm of Oppenheimer, Rosenberg, Kelleher & Wheatley.

He is a member of the Governor's Areawide Planning Advisory Committee on the 208 Project, which deals with surface water pollution recommendations.

A life-long resident of San Antonio, Rosenberg graduated from Texas Military Institute. He then attended the University of Texas, both at the undergraduate and law school levels, and in both instances graduated with honors. He was a member of the Texas Cowboys, Chancellors and Friars.

He served in the Air Force after his graduation until March, 1957, assigned to the Staff Judge Advocate's Office at Keesler Air Force Base, Biloxi, Miss.

Rosenberg has been in private law practice in San Antonio since leaving the Air Force, and has specialized in all phases of real estate law.

He is a past director of National Living Centers of America (now A.R.A.) and presently director of World Savings Association, Central Park Bank and San Pedro State Bank.

He is a member of the American Land Title Association and of the Real Estate Section of the State and American Bar Associations. He has participated as a lecturer in the Mortgage Lending Institute at the University of Texas and the State Bar Association and also served as a

director of the State Bar Real Estate Section.

Rosenberg also is a member of the State Bar Real Estate Liaison Committee with the Texas Land Title Association, which is making a special study of the title industry in Texas, its relation to attorneys and issuance of Title Policies.

He also has been active in numerous civic, academic and organization efforts.

In 1978, he served the Greater San Antonio Chamber of Commerce as vice chairman of the board, Governmental Affairs, and member of the Chamber's Executive Committee. He was a director of the Research and Planning Council.

With his eldest of three daughters now at the University of Texas, Rosenberg also serves on the Dad's Day Executive Committee and is a member of the University of Texas at San Antonio Associates.

Federal Estate Tax Return

Is Coffee Institute Topic

"How to prepare the Federal Estate Tax Return after the Reforms of 1976 and 1978" will be the topic of the SABA Coffee Institute scheduled for 1 p.m. Thursday, January 25, in the Commerce Room of the National Bank of Commerce.

The institute is sponsored by the San Antonio Estate Planning and Probate Law Association and the San Antonio Bar Association.

Larry W. Gibbs, Board Certified, Estate Planning and Probate Law, will be the moderator.

Other speakers include Ron Bruney, Austin Estate and Gift Tax Group, Internal Revenue Service; Allan G. Paterson, Jr., and Leonard Leighton, both Board Certified, Estate Planning and Probate Law, Texas Board of Legal Specialization.

All of the speakers will participate in a panel discussion and answer questions from the floor. Adjournment is scheduled for about 4 p.m.

Topics include ways to secure information, marital deductions after 1976 and methods of computation, and details on preparation of the tax returns.
